Overview:	The rugged Montsant massif of Catalonia defines the Priorat both visually and viticulturally. Its imposing sheer walls dominate a landscape of slate hills formed over the millennia. The vines burrow through crumbled rock for water. Paired with hot, arid summers and Mediterranean breezes, these are the conditions where traditional Garnatxa and Carinyena find their highest potential. With active viticulture dating to the 12th Century, the Priorat is as Old World as it gets. As the premier destination winery in the region, Perinet honors that history and infuses it with New World leadership and innovation. Located 90 minutes southwest of Barcelona, Perinet is the essence of the Priorat, a combination of the strong winegrowing history of the region, slate-laden soils and deep, concentrated wines with structure and balance. Perinet's flagship wine, 1194, pays homage to the Carthusian monastery of Scala Dei, which was founded in 1194, and whose monks introduced the art of viticulture to the Priorat. In the 18th century, the Perinet family settled on the land that is home to the modern wine-growing project that bears their name. Today, Perinet's state-

of-the-art winery, stunning barrel caves and estate vineyards help define the entire region's reputation.

Sustainability: Perinet is totally committed to sustainability and seeks to embrace the principals of the Paris Agreement. In 2020, Perinet committed to the installation of an 80 Kw PV solar system together with an energy storage system of 144 Kw, replacing an onsite diesel generator power plant. The solar project was successfully crowd funded via a loan provided by over 240 individual members of our community. The PV solar system became operational in Q1 2021 and is anticipated to supply over 90% of the winery's future electricity needs. This initiative is estimated to reduce Perinet's carbon footprint by 96 tons per annum in addition to eliminating noise pollution from the diesel generators. With this initiative, Perinet is leading the most important renewable energy project in the Priorat wine region. We believe that we must be stewards of the environment and this mindset is reflected first and foremost in our approach to viticulture. Perinet does not apply any synthetic pesticides or herbicides or other toxic chemicals in any of its vineyards. Furthermore, all field work, such as harvesting grapes or pruning vines, are completed by hand, without any mechanized support. Perinet has practiced organic farming for many years and the winery is under an EU certification process, anticipated to be completed in 2023. Our commitment to sustainability includes small everyday actions such as avoiding single-use plastic items as well as employing a local team and working with local suppliers. The total Perinet estate comprises 300 ha of which 70% is a Mediterranean wild forest with a rich natural ecosystem. The biodiversity within the estate includes rare species like Lluciapomaresius panteli (Somereta del Montsant) and the turtle Testudo hermanni. Additionally, to actively promote biodiversity, we host a bee farm, locating different hives around our forest
